

WHEREAS, on the 16th day of March, 1998, C. Harry Green, Tami T. Green, Mack Carr, Cindy Carr, being the owners of all the real property hereinafter described, did file with the City Clerk a petition asking that the said tracts or parcels of land be annexed to and become a part of the City of Hamilton; and

WHEREAS, said petition did contain the signatures of the owners of the described territory and a map of said property showing its relationship to the corporate limits of the City of Hamilton; and

WHEREAS, the governing body did determine that it is in the public interest that said property be annexed to the City of Hamilton and it did further determine that all legal requirements for annexing said real property have been met pursuant to Section 11-42-20 through 11-42-24, Code of Alabama, 1975;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF HAMILTON, ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Council of the City of Hamilton, Alabama finds and declares as the legislative body of the City that it is in the best interests of the citizens of the City, and the citizens of the affected area, to bring the territory described in Section 2 of this ordinance into the City of Hamilton.

Section 2. The boundary lines of the City of Hamilton, Alabama, be, and the same are hereby altered or rearranged so as to include all of the territory hereto before encompassed by the corporate limits of the City of Hamilton, Alabama, and in addition thereto the following described territory, to-wit:

The SW of the SW of Section 7, Township 12, Range 13.

The NW of the NW of Section 7, Township 12, Range 13 which lies South and West of U.S. Highway No. 43.

The SW of the SW of Section 6, Township \pm 1, Range 13 which lies South and West of U.S. Highway No. 43.

The NE of the NE of Section 12, Township 12, Range 14.

The NW of the NE of Section 12, Township 12, Range 14.

LESS AND EXCEPT a parcel of land containing 5 acres, more or less, situated in the Southwest Corner of the Southeast Quarter of Southeast Quarter of said Section 1, more particularly described as follows, to wit: "Beginning at the Southwest corner of said Southeast Quarter of Southeast Quarter; thence run North, along the West boundary of said Southeast Quarter of the Southeast Quarter, a distance of 1050 feet;

thence run East parallel with the South boundary of said Southeast Quarter of Southeast Quarter, a distance of 210 feet; thence run South, parallel with the West boundary of said Southeast Quarter of Southeast Quarter, a distance of 1050 feet to the South boundary of said Southeast Quarter of Southeast Quarter, thence run along the South boundary of said Southeast Quarter, thence run West, along the South boundary of said Southeast Quarter of Southeast Quarter, a distance of 210 feet to the point of beginning of the land herein excepted."

The SW of the SE of Section 1, Township 12, Range 14.

The NW of the SE of Section 1, Township 12, Range 14.

The NE of the SW of Section 1, Township 12, Range 14.

The SE of the SW of Section 1, Township 12, Range 14.

The SW of the SW of Section 2, Township 12, Range 14.


Section 3. This ordinance shall be published as provided by law, and a certified copy of same, together with a certified copy of the petition of the property owners, shall be filed with the Probate Judge of Marion County, Alabama.

Section 4. The territory described in this ordinance shall become a part of the corporate limits of Hamilton, Alabama, upon publication of this ordinance as set forth in section 3, above.


