Be it ordained by the Town Council of the Town of Hamilton, Alabama, as follows:

section 1 - It shall be unlawful for any person to park or leave standing an automobile, truck, or other vehicle, for a longer continuous period than two hours at a time, on or along the following streets in the Town of Hamilton, Alabama, to-wit:

First Avenue, S. W., between Military Street and First Street, West; East side of Military Street, from First Avenue, S. W., to Bexar Avenue, West;

North side of Bexar Avenue, West, from Military Street to Second Avenue, S. W.;

First Street, West, North from Second Avenue, South, to Toll Gate Garment Company.

Provided, however, that the parking regulations provided for herein shall apply only during the hours from 8 o'clock, a.m. to 4 o'clock, p.m. on all days except Sunday, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day, and the Fourth of July.

section 2 - Any person, firm, or corporation who parks or causes to be parked a vehicle in violation of the foregoing provisions of this ordinance shall be fined not less than \$1.00 nor more than \$50.00, and each such parking of a vehicle contrary to the provisions of this ordinance shall constitute a separate offense.

Section 3 - All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby expressly repealed.
